ASAP Committee Updates

Alcohol Initiatives Committee

April is Alcohol Awareness Month and the Alcohol Initiatives Committee began the month in full speed. Committee members along with our partnership with Mothers Against Drunk Driving and Pasco Fire and Rescue, participated into prom promise events. This powerful presentation is designed to highlight the dangers of driving while impaired. From this enactment, the hope is students will recognize the negative consequences of driving while impaired and gain an understanding one does not have to drink to enjoy prom. Students were invited to sign a "Friends Don't Let Friends Drive Impaired. The banners were then presented to each school to be placed on display. New Port Richey City Council presented AIC with a proclamation to honor alcohol awareness month and MADD's talk 21. In addition, the committee continues collecting data through our one-on-one conversations, last drink surveys and environmental scans. The committee is also in the early stages of planning for our second town hall event.

RX / Opioid Committee

The Opioid Committee has had a great start to 2024. We are currently planning our 4th Annual Townhall, "Prioritizing Community Voices", which will be held on Wednesday, May 15th 5-8pm at the Starkey Ranch Theatre Library Cultural Center. We will also be holding our first formal in person Overdose Fatality Review during our April Committee meeting. These meetings will be held on a quarterly basis to review fatal overdose cases provided by the Sheriff's

Office and discuss how we can improve our efforts to prevent overdose fatalities in the community. Our Narcan and Deterra Campaigns are continuing to go strong. We have had 366 Narcan QR code scans this year, and a total of 1,144 scans since launching the campaign in 2023. The Deactivate Opioids for a Safer Community campaign has given out nearly 50 bags since the start of this year, and a total of 8,925 bags since the program launch in 2021. 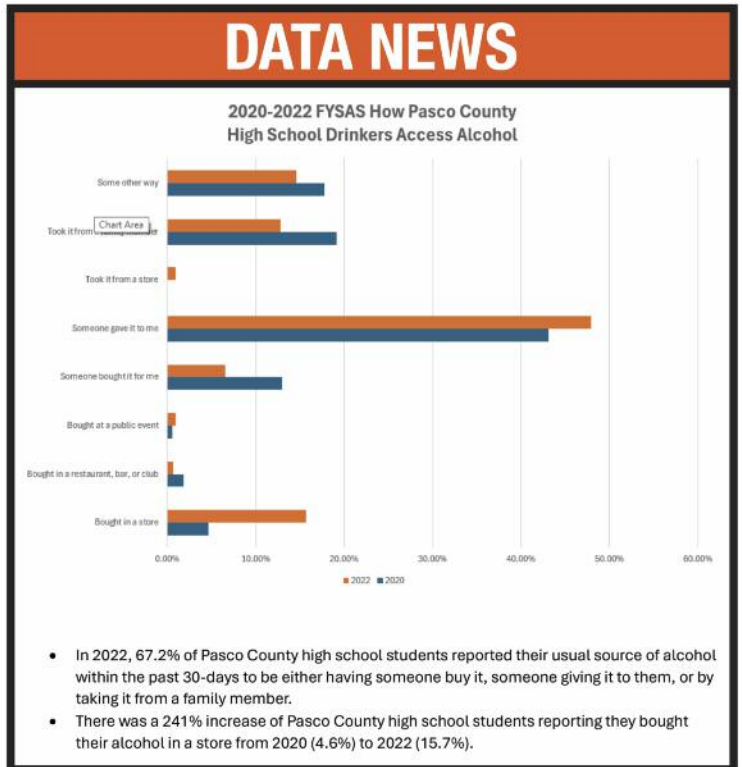

PRESENTATION DESCRIPTION:
It is designed to familiarize middle and high school with the five gateway drugs and the dangers associated with each. It outlines the road to addiction and what role gateway drugs plays in this process.

Advocacy Day in Tallahassee

On January 15, 16, and 17, STAND had the amazing opportunity to go to Tallahassee for Advocacy Day, hosted by Drug Free America. Four of STAND's advisors, Eve Hosley-Moore, Bonni Snider, Sandy Soares, and Makayla Damato took eight youth that displayed leadership: Maddie, Liam, Jaylynn, Cristalina, Darion, Devon, Jabrell, and Savannah. The first day, we visited the Tallahassee Museum to learn about Florida history, see animals, go zip-lining, and connect with each other. Afterwards, we headed to the Air BNB, where the youth got to have fun. The following day, we visited Florida State University before heading to an advocacy day training. The training discussed the schedule, topics, and how to best approach lawmakers. STAND youth showed initiative in answering questions, discussing who would speak about each topic, do the introduction and conclusion, and who would be in charge of giving the legislators the packets of information. That evening, the students researched and practiced, showing their focus and advocacy skills, before having one more evening of fun at the Air BNB.

On the last day, STAND joined coalitions from around the state at the Capitol Building to meet with lawmakers to discuss the substance use issues facing Florida youth, including the importance of prevention, delta 8, and alcohol delivery. The youth even got the opportunity to be a part of a press conference!

The youth spent the day visiting lawmakers often discussing their personal stories of what they have seen in their schools, community, and families. They left behind information on STAND, Delta 8, Alcohol Delivery, and the importance of prevention.

The youth were professional, knowledgeable, and gracious towards the legislators they met with, and as a result, they received a lot of positive feedback. The youth not only did an amazing job representing STAND and the Pasco County community and gained skills for their resume, but also had the chance to grow closer as a group of friends. STAND advisors thank the youth for all their hard work preparing for Advocacy Day and look forward to taking more STAND youth up to Tallahassee next year to make more change in our state capitol!
